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## The portfolio advantage

- Supplement classroom learning
  - Apply and integrate content
  - Experiences outside classroom

## The portfolio advantage

### Individualized

#### Substitution options

- Alternative Assignments

#### Self-paced completion

- Turn in 3x/semester
- Flexibility of completion
- Control when and where

## The portfolio advantage

### Individualized

#### Anonymous/blind-grading

- No judgment
- "Safe" expression

#### Leave comfort zone

- Confront controversy
- Challenge beliefs
- Question assumptions

## The portfolio advantage

### Increased self-awareness

- Emotions
- Beliefs, values
- Complacency
- Dissonance
- Identity formation
- Exposure to novelty
- Future goals

## The portfolio advantage

### Initiates Dialogue

- Family
- Friends
- Peers

### Deep Processing

- Reflection cements learning

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## Things to consider...

### Is this better than "traditional" measures

- End of semester surveys

## Things to consider...

### Death survey

- Favorite/least favorite
- Emotional struggles
- Submission preference
  - End; intermittent; corresponding
- Privacy
- Pacing

## Things to consider...

### Death survey

- Good assessment of knowledge?
  - YES: 30/30
  - "it's a good way of finding stuff out about yourself you wouldn't normally think of"
  - "You are able to see how you've progressed, and you know your understanding of things."
  - "It was more of my emotional understanding versus intellectual."
  - "it allows me to think about what I have learned and how it changed my perspective."
  - "they [the assignments] got me thinking and talking openly with family and friends."

## Things to consider...

- 📖 Is this better than “traditional” measures
  - 📖 End of semester surveys
  - 📖 PSYC 101 experiment

## Things to consider...

- 📖 Professional Obligations
  - 📖 Boundaries
  - 📖 Student Disclosure
  - 📖 HIPPA, FERPA, Etc.

## Things to consider...

- 📖 How do we grade this?
  - 📖 learning objectives vs. subjective journey of self-discovery
  - 📖 High vs. low “stakes”
  - 📖 Completeness vs. compliance
  - 📖 Perceived effort/evidence of deep thought

## Things to consider...

- 📖 How much time will this take?
  - 📖 Students: Completion time
  - 📖 Professors: Grading time

## Take Away...

- 📖 Portfolios are a collection of student work
- 📖 Opportunity for significant learning
  - 📖 Especially in sensitive courses
